From the 4th Fighter Wing, Office of the Staff Judge Advocate. The following military justice and administrative actions completed in the **third quarter of the calendar year for 2023.**

COURTS-MARTIAL

A **Senior Airman** from the 4th Munitions Squadron was found guilty at a General Court-Martial for <u>Sexual Assault Without Consent</u>. The **Senior Airman's** sentence consisted of a Dishonorable Discharge, 9 months confinement, and reduction to E-1.

A **Staff Sergeant** from the 4th Logistics Readiness Squadron was found guilty at a General Court-Martial for <u>Failure to Go</u>, <u>Resisting Apprehension</u>, <u>Disrespect Toward a Superior Commissioned Officer</u>, <u>Willfully Disobeying a Superior Commissioned Officer</u>, <u>Disrespect Toward a Noncommissioned Officer</u>, <u>Willfully Disobeying a Noncommissioned Officer</u>, and <u>Wrongful Use of Delta-9 THC</u>. The **Staff Sergeant's** sentence consisted of 215 days confinement, reduction to E-1, and forfeiture of \$200 pay per month for four months.

NONJUDICIAL PUNISHMENT UNDER ARTICLE 15, UCMJ

Nonjudicial punishment under Article 15, UCMJ, provides commanders with an essential and prompt means of maintain good order and discipline and/or promote positive behavior changes in servicemembers.

A **Technical Sergeant** from the 4th Equipment Maintenance Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>Drunkenness</u>. The Technical Sergeant's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Staff Sergeant, forfeiture of \$1,937.00 pay per month for one month (suspended), and a reprimand.

A **Staff Sergeant** from the 4th Component Maintenance Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>Dishonorable Failure to Pay Debt</u>. The Staff Sergeant's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Senior Airman and a reprimand.

A **Senior Airman** from the 333rd Fighter Generation Squadron accepted an Article 15 for Wrongful Use of Delta-8 THC. The Senior Airman's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, forfeiture of \$1,201.00 pay per month for one month (suspended), and a reprimand.

A **Senior Airman** from the 334th Fighter Generation Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>Drunk on Duty</u>. The Senior Airman's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman First Class and a reprimand.

A **Senior Airman** from the 4th Operational Medical Readiness Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>Failure to Obey and Willful Dereliction of Duty</u>. The Senior Airman's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, forfeiture of \$500.00 pay per month for two months and a reprimand.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Operational Medical Readiness Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>Wrongful Use of Delta-8 THC.</u> The Airman First Class' punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman (suspended) and a reprimand.

An **Airman First Class** from the 334th Fighter Generation Squadron accepted an Article 15 for Wrongful Use of Delta-9 THC. The Airman First Class' punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman and a reprimand.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Civil Engineer Squadron accepted an Article 15 for Wrongful Use of Delta-8 THC. The Airman First Class' punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman, forfeiture of \$500.00 pay per month for two months (suspended), and a reprimand.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Operational Medical Readiness Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>Failure to Go.</u> The Airman First Class' punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman and forfeiture of \$1,074.00 per month for one month (suspended).

ADMINISTRATIVE DISCHARGES

Commanders and supervisors identify members who show a likelihood for early separation and make reasonable efforts to help these members meet Air Force standards. Members who do not show potential for future service should be discharged.

An Administrative demotion is a quality force management tool commanders have to help ensure a quality enlisted force. Administrative demotions are intended to place Airmen at a rank commensurate with their skill level and ability.
