## **\*CHILD CARE FOR VOLUNTEERS PROGRAM\*\*\***

The Air Force Aid Society provides funding for bases that have the need for child care funds for volunteers and have the personnel available to make the program work. Child care is provided in certified Family Child Care Homes on base or in Air Force Affiliated Homes off base. The program is not meant to replace funds available for this purpose through other agencies, but to increase the number of volunteers at a base. Volunteers may work in any number of traditional volunteer activities that benefit the base as a whole. There are certain programs that are not eligible for childcare funding, e.g. any revenue making activities (thrift store, CDC, etc.) or any long-term full-time program. Although, we recognize the importance of the Key Spouse program, AFAS at this time does not provide childcare funding.
