From the desk of the Staff Judge Advocate, 4th Fighter Wing:

The following military justice and administrative actions completed in the third quarter (July-September) 2021.

ARTICLE 15

Nonjudicial punishment under Article 15, UCMJ, provides commanders with an essential and prompt means of maintaining good order and discipline and/or promote positive behavior changes in servicemembers.

A **Senior Airman** from the 4th Equipment Maintenance Squadron accepted an Article 15 for wrongful use of a tetrahydrocannabinoid (Delta 8). The Senior Airman's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, 10 days extra duty, and a reprimand.

A **Staff Sergeant** from the 4th Equipment Maintenance Squadron accepted an Article 15 for wrongful use of marijuana. The Staff Sergeant's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Senior Airman and a reprimand.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Equipment Maintenance Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>wrongful use and possession of marijuana</u>. The Airman First Class's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman Basic, forfeiture of \$103.00 pay per month for two months, and a reprimand.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Component Maintenance Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>wrongful use of marijuana</u>. The Airman First Class' punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman, 15 days extra duty, and a reprimand.

A **Technical Sergeant** from the 4 Logistics Readiness Squadron accepted an Article 15 for sexual harassment. The Technical Sergeant's punishment included a suspended reduction to the grade of Staff Sergeant, suspended forfeitures of \$1,702 pay per month for 2 months, 45 days extra duty and a reprimand.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Equipment Maintenance Squadron accepted an Article 15 for <u>failure to go to place of duty and failure to obey a general order or regulation</u>. The Airman First Class' punishment included reduction to the grade of Airman, 45 extra duty days, suspended forfeitures of \$216.00 pay per month for 2 months and a reprimand.

A **Technical Sergeant** from the 4th Logistics Readiness Squadron accepted an Article 15 for drunk and disorderly conduct. The Technical Sergeant's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Staff Sergeant, forfeiture of \$500 pay per month for 2 months and a reprimand.

A **Senior Airman** from the 4th Munitions Squadron accepted an Article 15 for being <u>drunk on duty</u>. The Senior Airman's punishment included a reduction to the grade of Airman and a reprimand.

DISCHARGES

Commanders and supervisors identify members who show a likelihood for early separation and make reasonable efforts to help these members meet Air Force standards. Members who do not show potential for future service should be discharged.

A Captain from the 4th Operations Group was administratively discharged by the Secretary of the Air Force or his designee for <u>serious or recurring misconduct punishable by military or civilian authorities</u>. The Captain was separated with a general (under honorable conditions) service characterization.

An **Airman** from the 4th Equipment Maintenance Squadron was administratively discharged for misconduct: drug abuse. The Airman was separated with a general (under honorable conditions) service characterization.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron was administratively discharged for <u>misconduct</u>: <u>minor disciplinary infractions</u>. The Airman was separated with a general (under honorable conditions) service characterization.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Civil Engineer Squadron was administratively discharged for <u>conditions not constituting a physical disability</u>: <u>personality disorder or mental disorder not constituting a physical disability</u>. The Airman was separated with an Honorable service characterization.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Component Maintenance Squadron was administratively discharged for <u>misconduct</u>: <u>drug abuse</u>. The Airman was separated with a general (under honorable conditions) service characterization.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Equipment Maintenance Squadron was administratively discharged for <u>misconduct</u>: <u>minor disciplinary infractions</u>. The Airman First Class was separated with a general (under honorable conditions) service characterization.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Equipment Maintenance Squadron was administratively discharged for <u>misconduct</u>: <u>drug abuse</u>. The Airman First Class was separated with a general (under honorable conditions) service characterization.

A **Senior Airman** from the 4th Component Maintenance Squadron was administratively discharged for <u>conditions not constituting a physical disability</u>: <u>personality disorder or mental disorder not constituting a physical disability</u>. The Airman was separated with an honorable service characterization.

An **Airman First Class** from the 4th Munitions Squadron was administratively discharged for <u>unsatisfactory performance</u>: failure to progress in military training. The Airman First Class was separated with an honorable service characterization.

DEMOTIONS

An administrative demotion is a quality force management tool commanders have to help ensure a quality enlisted force. Administrative demotions are intended to place Airmen at a rank commensurate with their skill level and ability.

An **Airman** from the 4th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron was administratively demoted to Airman Basic for <u>driving under the influence of alcohol</u> with a breath alcohol concentration of 0.13.

A **Technical Sergeant** from the 4th Operations Support Squadron was administratively demoted to Staff Sergeant for <u>driving under the influence of alcohol</u> with a breath alcohol concentration of 0.13.

A **Senior Airman** from the 4th Security Forces Squadron was administratively demoted to Airman First Class for <u>driving under the influence of alcohol</u> with a breath alcohol concentration of 0.17.

An **Airman** from the 4th Logistics Readiness Squadron was administratively demoted to Airman Basic for driving under the influence of alcohol with a breath alcohol concentration of 0.16.

An **Airman** from the 4th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron was administratively demoted to Airman Basic for <u>driving under the influence of alcohol</u> with a breath alcohol concentration of 0.13.

A **Senior Airman** from the 704th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron was administratively demoted to Airman First Class for <u>failure to keep fit</u>.
